The Montana Library Association Intellectual Freedom Committee (MLA-IFC) maintains a record of challenges made to library materials in the state. The information for this record is compiled with the attached Library Materials Challenge Report form. "A challenge is an attempt to remove or restrict materials, based upon the objections of a person or group. Challenges do not simply involve a person expressing a point of view; rather, they are an attempt to remove material from the curriculum or library, thereby restricting the access of others" – ALA Office of Intellectual Freedom.

Every individual has the right to both seek out and obtain information from all points of view without restriction and it is MLA's responsibility to promote freedom of access to information and assist our Montana libraries when they are faced with a challenge. It is important that IFC records and archives Montana library experiences in facing and resolving a challenge as it can be helpful to other libraries in the future. It is particularly important to report the outcome.

Whenever an incident occurs in your library, please complete the Library Materials Challenge Report form. The IFC Committee's goal is to keep data on all objections/challenges to materials, regardless if they are resolved informally or continue through the formal challenge process. If the challenge is resolved quickly, one form can be submitted with both the challenge and resolution information included. If the challenge takes longer to be resolved, a form can be submitted when the challenge occurs and again when there is a final resolution

This information is valuable to both staff who need to implement library policies/procedures and to patrons who need to understand how materials are selected for the library collection.
